The Evaluation Center (the Center) takes pride in providing meaningful employment and learning opportunities for students pursuing graduate education at the University of Colorado Denver. Graduate Assistants are true members of our team whose contributions are essential to the success of the organization. We push our Graduate Assistants to take on meaningful work within larger projects and ask them to provide input into the projects they support. This graduate assistant position serves as the coordinator for the State Epidemiological Workgroup (SEOW) and at times provides support to other projects at The Evaluation Center.

Graduate Assistant positions in the Center are part-time positions for students pursuing advanced degrees. We encourage students from a wide variety of relevant academic disciplines to apply. Graduate Assistants can work and learn across projects to support activities including, but not limited to, project planning, instrument development, data collection, data entry and analysis, and report development. In addition, students may be asked to provide coordination and administrative support to ongoing projects.

The Colorado SEOW brings together public health and safety experts from many state and local agencies. The SEOW Coordinator has the opportunity to meet, network, and build relationships with these professionals. The coordinator gains a sense of how representatives of state agencies interact, share and understand data, and view issues of substance use. Substance use is related to individual, familial, and societal risk and protective factors. The coordinator has the opportunity to learn about substance use issues *and* factors that impact it across our communities. The Colorado SEOW uses epidemiological data to develop publications for public use. The coordinator can gain valuable professional experience working with epidemiologists, understanding substance use trends in Colorado, and communicating epidemiological data to the public.

Part-Time Effort Limits

Graduate students are permitted to work up to 25 hours per week during Fall and Spring Semesters and 40 hours per week during Summer Semester. These hour limits apply to hours worked across *all* positions at the University. Graduate students are paid starting hourly rate of \$20/hour with opportunities to earn \$21/hour within the first year. Within The Evaluation Center, schedules are determined based on project need and student availability to comply with the hour limitations stated above.
